Our question for this half term is: How did London catch on fire?



English



In English we will be looking at two books linked to the great fire of London. Our main book will be "The Great Fire of London" which retells the events of the great fire of London in a child friendly way. We will use this book to delve into non-fiction texts and create warning posters and our own diary entry.

As we begin to learn about the UK and all it's amazing landmarks we will then read a book called "A Walk in London". This is a lovely story of a little girl and her mother who have a wonderful adventure in London. We will use this book to write our very own quidebook.



Maths

We are going to begin the Summer Term continuing to recap Multiplication and Division. This is a very important skill that the children can apply to many other aspects in maths. We will then move onto our next block of learning which is measurement: length and height. Make sure the children continue to access Mathletics at home, it is really helping the children retain the learning that occurs in the classroom and is a great way to help their learning stick.

Science

Our science topic this half term is plants. This comes at a great time in the year because not only are all the plants beginning to grow, Class Rowan have also just planted potatoes in our school garden. We will learn all about how plants grow and how to care for them and then be able to use this learning to observe the growth of our potatoes and make sure we care for them correctly.
