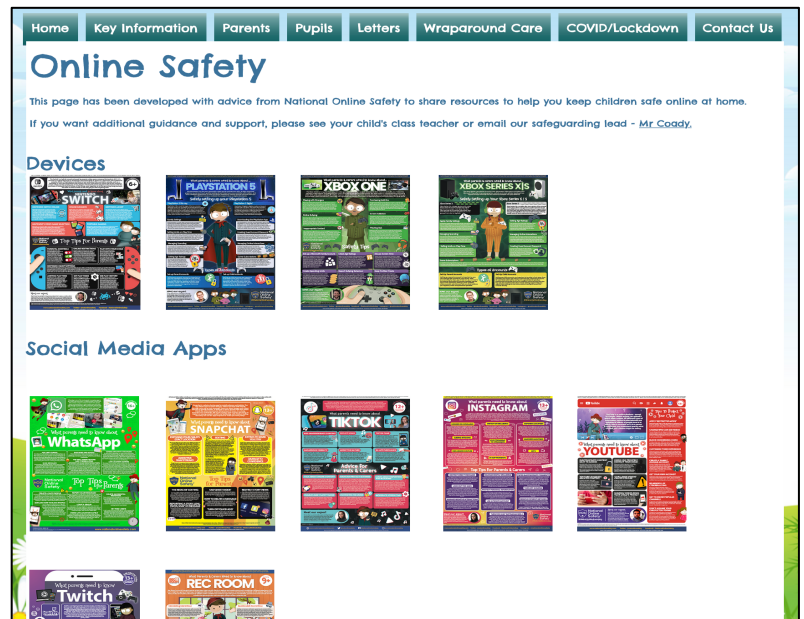


Outdoor Learning
